Prepare Your Evacuation Kit

- Medications and prescriptions
 - One gallon of water per person, per day for at least three days
 - A three-day supply of non-perishable food for each person in your household
 - Cellphones with chargers and backup batteries
 - Personal items like clothing, hygiene items, and bedding
 - Health and safety items like flashlights, a first aid kit, sunscreen, bug repellent
 - Cash, credit cards & important documents
 - Video or photos of your home, inside & out, along with any valuables inside your home
 - Proof of address (May be needed to access your home upon your return)
 - Contact list – names & phone numbers

Know What to Listen for and What it Means

Tropical Storm Watch

Tropical storm conditions (sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph) are possible within the specified coastal area within 48 hours.

Tropical Storm Warning

Tropical storm conditions (sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph) are expected somewhere within the specified coastal area within 36 hours.

Hurricane Watch

Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or higher) are possible within the specified area. The hurricane watch is issued 48 hours in advance of the anticipated onset of tropical storm-force winds.

Hurricane Warning

Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or higher) are expected somewhere within the specified area. The hurricane warning is issued 36 hours in advance of the anticipated onset of tropical storm-force winds.

Know What To Do

Before the Storm (The best time to prepare for a storm is before the storm hits)

Develop Your Evacuation Plan

- Discuss temporary shelter arrangements with your friends and family
- Plan an evacuation route that avoids flood-prone roads and bridges
- Prepare an emergency contact list
- Move your car to higher ground to avoid flooding

- Register with HCFLGov.net/HCFLAlert for storm updates, shelter openings, evacuation notices, etc.

During the Storm

Once an evacuation order is issued for Longboat, we must evacuate immediately as storm-force winds can destroy a manufactured home.

Stay Informed and Ready

- Watch for news from the National Weather Service
- Review your plan and consider evacuating early
- Make sure your devices are charged

Prepare Your Home and Evacuate

- Turn your refrigerator and freezer to the coldest settings
- Move valuable items away from windows or take them with you
- Bring in or anchor down outdoor furniture, grills, or planters
- Shut off your water and gas supply
- Take photos of house and contents for insurance record
- Lock up and leave

After the Storm

Emergency services may not be available for days or weeks. This is when most storm-related injuries and deaths occur.

Before Returning Home

- Stay tuned to local media for updates and return only after it is reported safe to do so
- Have your picture I.D. with current address
- Drive only if necessary, and avoid flooded roads or standing water

Stay Safe at Home

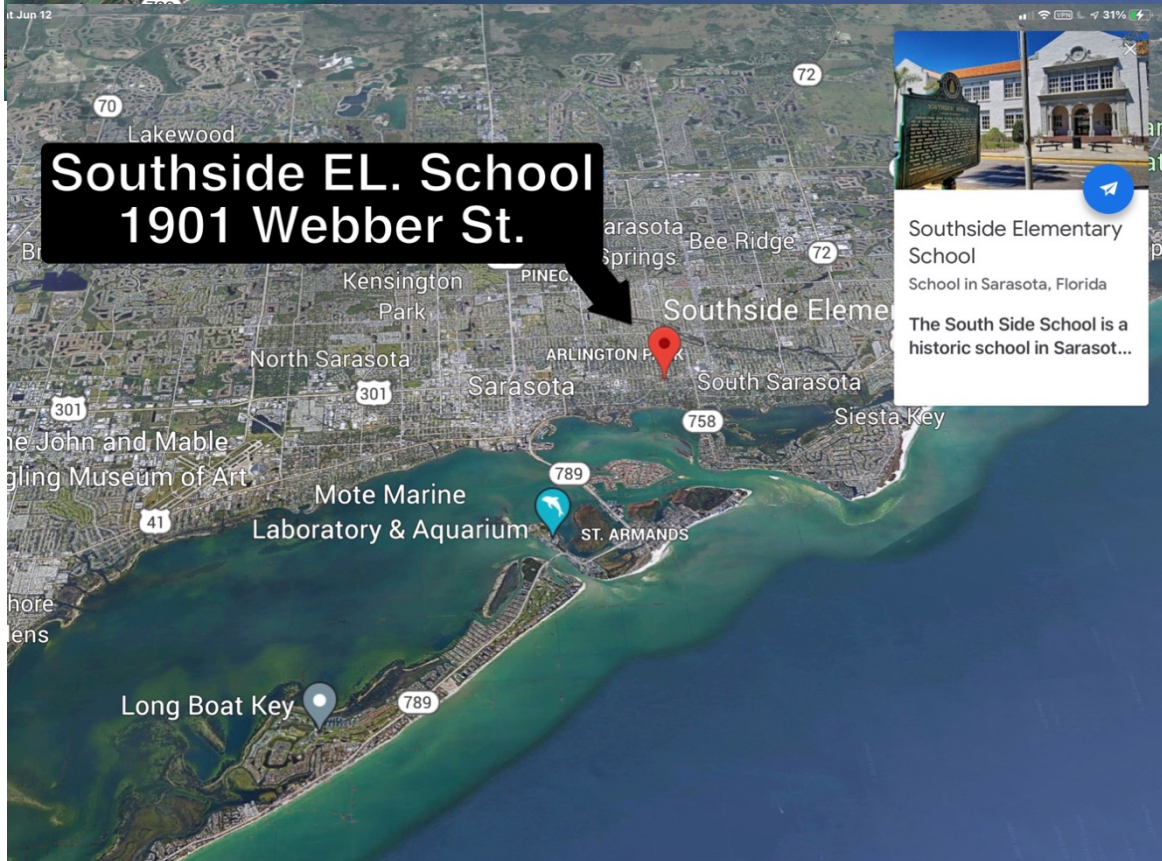
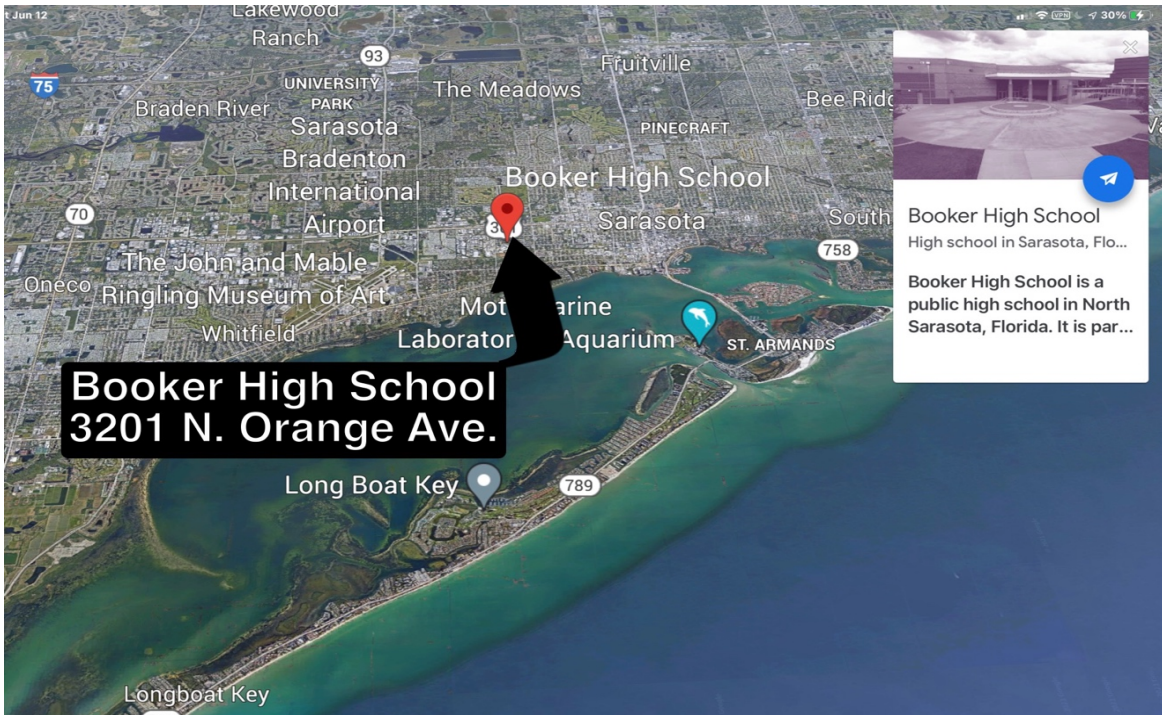
- Make sure your home is stable, and be careful entering
- Do not touch downed or dangling power lines
- Do not walk in water or over piles of debris
- If local water is not available:
 - Boil your water for at least one minute
 - Chlorinate your water or purify your water with tablets
- If electrical service was interrupted, discard refrigerated food
- If your home was flooded, discard all dry goods

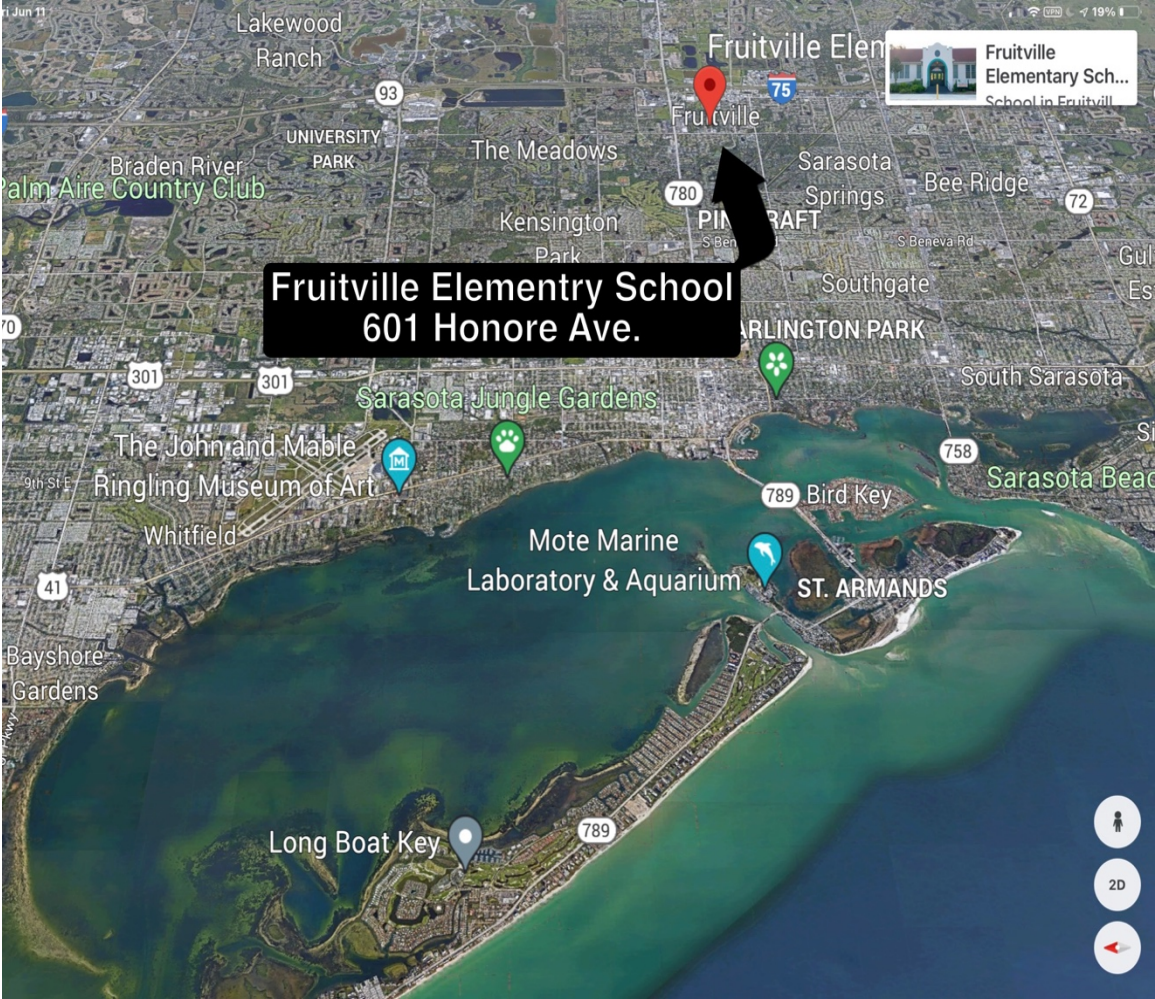
Know Where To Go *(Select Location & Plan Route)

Create a pre-storm Photo Record of Park Infrastructure & all Unit Exteriors

Walking Pre-Storm Park inspection & preparation

Beach, Pool & Clubhouse preparation

Post Event Damage Inspection

Create Photo record of damage

Damage Report to residents (Website & Facebook with video)

Report Damage to town Code Enforcement

Park Cleanup coordination (all hands-on deck as neighbors help neighbors)

Get permission
